



## LOVE FOR MYANMAR MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS 2024

Formed: Granted 501 (c) (3) non-profit status by the IRS in 2008. Donations are tax exempt.

Purposes: *Encourage-* provide compassionate care to children and adults who have experienced the trauma of abandonment, abuse, disease, persecution, and violence. *Equip-* train house church leaders, children's home directors to maintain a joyful focus on Jesus Christ while nurturing new believers and energizing more people to want to learn more about our Lord. *Empower-* provide food, clothing, medical supplies to abandoned children, educational tutoring to children in leprosy villages, and vocational training for young adults.

Myanmar (Burma): bordered by India, Bangladesh, China, Laos, and Thailand; 51.3 million people, 88% Buddhist

Primary ministries- DISCIPLESHIP DEVELOPMENT through network of 34 house churches, HUMANITARIAN CARE of 130 children in five orphanages and over 1,000 families in rural areas, TRAUMA HEALING for adults, youth, and children villagers including patients at a leprosy hospital and nearby leprosy villages as well as new ministry for widows

Financial support- individual donors 64%, churches & non profits 36%

Donor dollars investment: Ministries or programs investment 96.43%, administrative or operational expenses 3.57% average of last three years

2024 Blessing Highlights: **90** baptisms throughout ministry areas, house church network increased to nearly **700** members, over **3,000** villagers provided food supplies through **43** outreach events, developed and personally handed out over **130,000** Gospel tracts in Burmese while making **720** visits to rural villages, met with **78** local pastors, conducted **64** online Bible study and discipleship training sessions, started school (**80** students) in remote village in Tanintharyi Division, organized and led **260** Christian-based tutoring sessions for school-aged children, remodeled community center in leprosy village, provided **1,430** sermons and Sunday school classes, converted used vehicle into a medical transport for rural villagers, built structures in secluded, safe area for youth escaping junta army recruitment, conducted **114** Christian-based trauma healing sessions, supported the trauma healing certification of key staff through the American Bible Society
